
# Children, Youth & Families

- 20 Children & youth under 16 years presented to hospital for SA related concerns
- 50 Youth who utilized the youth emergency shelter, (YES Shelter) due to DV/IPV situations
- 4 Families utilized the youth emergency shelter, (YES Shelter) due to DV/IPV situations
- 40 CAS children and families supported by DV/SA caseworkers (KHCAS)
- 40 Children in Indigenous child witness to violence program



Gender-based violence is one of the leading causes of homelessness among women and children

Gender-based violence is a major cause of homelessness and housing instability among women and children. Women fleeing abuse often lack access to safe and affordable housing, which is a significant barrier [3]. Peterborough's low vacancy rate (1.1% in 2023, the 4th lowest in Ontario)[4], high rates of poverty and very limited affordable housing pose significant barriers to people seeking to leave abuse [5].



### DV/IPV is complex

- Underreporting makes it difficult to capture statistics that reflect the number of people impacted.
- DV/IPV cases often involve multiple issues and sectors, requiring the involvement of multiple responses.
- Many services including those for mental health have had to implement waitlists for service.
- The primary care shortage creates another barrier for survivors as some services i.e. Mental health often require referrals from an MD.
- Femicide can have various definitions; it refers to the killing of a woman or child by a man. OAITH compiles monthly and annual Femicide counts for Ontario based on media reports. As of October 31, 2024 there had been 59 Femicides in Ontario since November 26, 2023 [6]

### PDAN Plans

- Service navigation improvements
- Continued engagement with survivor consultants
- A community-wide survey on attitudes toward gendered violence
- Public education campaign to address needs identified in survey
- New outreach and education materials & campaign that addresses any key findings from that survey
- Formalized partnerships and data sharing agreements with partner organizations
- Ongoing training, support and information between organizations supporting survivors.
